Informed consent for anaesthesia for endoscopic procedures

General information

Anaesthesia in the form of intravenous analgo-sedation ensures patient safety during and immediately after the procedure. During anaesthesia, the patient is monitored by an anaesthesiologist. Drugs are administered intravenously. During the procedure, the patient feels no pain, consciousness is limited or the patient is unconscious.

Overview of anaesthesia

- During endoscopic procedure, the anaesthesiologist controls the vital functions of the patient's body. Heart rate, blood pressure, blood oxygenation are monitored by 'recording equipment'.
- After the procedure, the patient is transported to the Observation Room where he/she remains under the care of an anaesthesiologist. The observation time depends on the patient's condition and type of procedure performed.

Possible complications

As with any medical intervention, anaesthesia carries a certain risk of complications. The probability of life-threatening complications is minimal; it mainly depends on the patient's general condition and the type of endoscopic procedure performed. Rare complications include allergic reaction to medicines, respiratory and cardiovascular disorders.

The anaesthesiologist is prepared to immediately treat them effectively.
